Legislative changes to the School Attendance

The Minister for Education has approved changes to the use of the Attendance Register codes for 2015 in **all schools** across NSW. These changes are in response to the research conducted by ACER (the Australian Council of Educational Research) and our Nations results, as compared to other countries internationally. This valuable research indicates that Australian students are not performing at the levels expected. In determining why this is so, it has been discovered that the impact of student absences on their learning is of great concern, therefore the Government has reviewed the policies and procedures relating to student attendance and has made the following changes which must be implemented immediately in all schools.

These changes will implement the **ACARA National Standards for Student Attendance Data Reporting.**

ACARA developed the National Standards to establish nationally consistent parameters for the collection and reporting of student attendance data.

Holidays

As part of the implementation of the National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school vacation periods will now be **included as absences**. A **Certificate of Exemption can no longer be granted for this purpose**.

Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations. If travel during school term is necessary the following considerations apply:

- If the principal **accepts** the reason for the absence, the absence will be marked as “**L**” (Approved Leave).
- If the principal does not believe the absence is in the student’s best interests and does not accept the reason, the absence is unjustified and will be recorded as “**A**” (**The student’ absence has not been explained in writing or the Principal does not accept the explanation**)
- If the period of absence is in excess of **50 days**, the student may be eligible to enrol in Distance Education. However, that will mean that the student will no longer be enrolled at St Columba’s, as a **student cannot be enrolled in more than one school concurrently (including Distance Education)**
***For that period the student’s enrolment transfers to the distance education school.**

School Fees

The school fee statements for Term 1, 2015 will be mailed out on Wednesday 11th February. The due date for payment is on or before Friday 6th March 2015. If you have not received your statement by Wednesday 18th February, please contact me on 4754 8902 to arrange for a copy to be sent home.

The Flexible Payment Plan will again be offered as an option for the payment of 2015 fees. The necessary information required to take up this convenient payment alternative will be provided with your Term 1 fee statement. Please note that if you wish to be included in the Flexible Payment Plan option, all paperwork needs to be returned to Catholic Education Office, Parramatta no later than **27th February 2015**.

The Catholic Education Office is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete a Statement of Financial Position so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

N.B. If you were on a payment arrangement for 2014 (except Flexible Payment Plan) it is important that you contact me when you receive your Term 1 statement so that I am aware of your intentions for 2015.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to the Catholic Education Office for actioning.

Early collection of students

If you need to collect your child early in the day there are two ways to do this:

1. Pre-arranged appointment

Fill in the appointment slip in your child's diary. Alternatively, you can send in a letter stating the reason they need to leave early and the time they are due to leave.

They will then have this signed by their Leader of Mission in the morning. At the appropriate time, they will show this to their classroom teacher and then come to Student Services (with the letter) to be signed out. You can then meet them in the archway for collection.

2. Un-planned appointment

For an emergency you can ring Student Services and we will arrange to have your child waiting for you at the student office where you will need to sign them out.

You can come to Student Services and we can arrange for someone to get them out of class. Please note, sometimes there is a delay with this due to unforeseen circumstances.

- Parents are not to ring and request their child be at Student Services ready to be picked up for an appointment. Parents should send a note to school with their child, who then gets the note signed by their Leader of Mission and brings it to Student Services when they want to sign out. The student then waits at the archway for their parent.

Sickbay

If your child is not well enough to be at school, please do not send them to school. Students will be given 15-20 mins in Sick Bay and then sent back to class. If they are not well enough to return to class, parents will be called to pick their child up from school. If parents are not contactable, the emergency contact person will be phoned and asked to pick up the student. If your child rings or messages you saying they are unwell, please encourage your child to come to Sick Bay. That way we know they are safe and being looked after.

Sport

Thursday Sport

Our College has enjoyed many years of participation in the Nepean Zone Wednesday Sport competition and we are grateful to have had this opportunity. As you are aware we are now conducting sport at various times on Thursdays. This change has occurred for a variety of reasons and we are confident that the students will still have a large amount of opportunities to still be involved in competitive sport and recreational activities.

Year 7, 8 and 9 are each involved in a House Competition and will compete weekly in a variety of sports; these sports will change each term. We are also excited to be able to provide an opportunity for students to focus on skill development from expert coaches. This term the Western Sydney Giants Development staff will be providing professional coaching to all students. The cost for this program has been heavily reduced and students will receive four and a half hours of coaching and receive an AFL ball for only \$20. This fee is not included in the sports levy and can be paid to the school throughout the first 2-3 weeks of the term. We are currently negotiating with other sporting organisations to provide similar experiences for the students in terms 2-4.

Year 10 students have the opportunity to select from a variety of recreational activities, skill development and competitive sport each term. These options will vary somewhat from term to term to provide a meaningful and balanced program for each student.

2015年日本短期留学研修 Japan Study Tour 2015

A group of 27 Years 9 and 10 St Columba's Catholic College's students visited St Columba's sister school, Hokusetsu Sanda Senior High School in Hyogo, in Japan during the last school holidays. The group was accompanied by our Principal Mr Paul Ryan, Mr John James and Japanese teachers Mrs Shizue Sato and Miss Elizabeth McArthur. All the staff and the students were very excited to see the Japanese friends that they made during Hokusetsu Sanda High School's visit to Australia in August last year. Two St Columba's students, Luke Jones and Liam Holmes, who have been on the 6 month exchange program at Hokusetsu, also travelled with the group.

The relationship between Hokusetsu Sanda Senior High School and St Columba's has been strongly established for more than 23 years. The group was warmly and generously welcomed by Hokusetsu.

Our Principal Mr Paul Ryan made a speech to thank the Sanda Community for their generosity of sending money to the Blue Mountain's community when we had the horrific bush fires in October 2013. The friendship has strengthened through the continuation of the sister school relationship between Hokusetsu Sanda High School and St Columba's Catholic College and the sister city relationship between Sanda City and the city of Blue Mountains.

The two-week Japan study tour was a great success and everyone had a wonderful time. The students had an opportunity to experience Japanese life style during their homestay and visit some of the most famous temples and shrines, including some of the World Heritage sites in Kyoto, Nara, Hiroshima, Miyajima, Osaka and Tokyo. They were able to learn about the historical aspects of Japan, as well as to see the advanced technology of Japan when they travelled to Tokyo and met the humanoid robot ASIMO.

Students have not only benefited from contextual study of the Japanese language through interaction with Japanese people in their native language environment but also have learnt and developed important lifelong skills to assist their development into mature young members of society.




