Everyone is trying to become the best person he or she can be. We are always finding out what we can and cannot do, what's right and what's wrong, how to handle our problems, who we can really trust, and how we are alike and different from everyone else. With all this going on you can feel very confused sometimes. And when you're feeling confused it can be very difficult to decide what's right for you.

The best advice I can give you is to:

- Take the risks necessary to make your dreams come true.
- Trust your intuitions about people, about the right directions to take and decisions to make.
- Find people who will help and support you.
- Use your creativity and imagination to make school work for you.

You can make things happen, you can open new doors, you can make a difference, you can be responsible, you can start this minute.

Living without dreams is like speeding in the dark down a motorway and not knowing where you are going. You are never quite ready for changes, things just seem to come out of nowhere and happen to you, you can only react and usually too late. It is scary to drive like that and scary to go through life this way too. Our dreams pull us forward and give meaning to our lives. When you lose the courage to dream, you can lose your sense of direction in life and be too easily swayed by people who think they know the direction that's best for you.

All around us we are surrounded by the results of other people's dreams – people who mixed inspiration with courage and a little luck. As you find the courage to move in the direction of what you dream for yourself, you will be amazed at how the world will move to support you.

A history of the Seminary Years & Beyond

St. Columba's College is a landmark that is well known not only to Springwood locals but also to many residents of the central Blue Mountains. The choice of Springwood as the location of the Catholic Church's first minor seminary in Australia was not only important for the Catholic community, but also for what the establishment of the seminary would bring to the local community. The purchase of the property by the Church would have a significant influence upon the way in which north Springwood (later Winmalee) developed.



Established in the early 20th century, St. Columba's College would draw students from across Australia. For well over half a century, it would continue to grow until, over the space of a few short years, student numbers declined and in 1977 the seminary doors would close only to re-open just one year later as a Catholic high school.

This is the story of that institution - its establishment, development and the nature of daily life for those that passed through its gates.

This Advent season we are all encouraged to "pay it forward" and bring kindness and love to others by becoming an "Advent Angel".

Google defines "pay it forward" as: responding to a person's kindness to oneself by being kind to someone else

How does it work?

Do between one and three good deeds for others without asking for anything in return. Instead, the recipient should pay it forward to someone else in need.

For example: you might offer to help someone with their LP which you know they are struggling with. Then that person pays it forward by doing a good deed for another person.

It can be as simple as carrying someone's bag to class for them or shouting the next person in the canteen

HSC TRUE REWARD What is HSC True Reward?

This is the only program of its kind in NSW; open to 2017 NSW HSC students that make an early offer for entry to a degree based on corresponding HSC subject band outcomes.

At Western, we believe hard work deserves its own reward – a reward that reflects your ability to succeed. If you do well in your subjects at school, we know you can go on to do well university.

Applications are now open. Offers will be made on December 14 – the same day HSC results are released, and a full day before ATARs are released.

To apply for Western Sydney University HSC True Reward early offer program, apply via online portal on our website. All students need is their HSC student number and 4 digit PIN to get started.

How is it different?

It's based on HSC, not ATAR. Western is the only university in NSW to offer a program with the chance to apply for an early offer based on HSC, not ATAR. It is one of many programs offered by Western Sydney University.

What are the requirements?

You need to meet a specified Band outcome in nominated subjects related to the degree.

Which courses are available to HSC True Reward?

All courses excluding Music, Paramedicine, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Podiatry, Law (on its owngraduate and non-graduate entry), Midwifery, Medicine, Ba Arts (Pathway to teaching birth-5-birth-12/Masters of Teaching (Birth-5/Birth-12) Diploma pathway, Ba Education (Primary) ASTIE and Open Access via The College.

What are the HSC subject band requirements to receive a HSC True Reward offer?

Depending on the degree requirements vary. There is a list of requirements on our website.

When do applications open and close?

Applications are now open.

Applications close midnight, 11 December, 2017. HSC True Reward early offers will be made on December 14, from 10am onwards. This is the same day that HSC subject band outcomes are released.

How will you know if you get an offer?

Students will receive a HSC True Reward early offer from Western from 10am onwards on Thursday 14th December. It will arrive at the email address originally used to apply for the program. The email will provide details about how to enroll at Western to secure the offer (an easy 4 step process). As backup, they will also receive an SMS (to the mobile phone number you originally used to apply for the program) informing of the offer on Thursday 14th December.

Do offers expire?

HSC True Reward early offers will have an effective (and enforced) expiry date of 22 December 2017, 5pm. To ensure the offer does not expire, students need to complete stage 3 of your enrolment by this date.

How many Western preferences are needed?

The minimum number of preferences is 1. The preferences that will be considered for HSC True Rewards are preference 1 and preference 2 only.

Can UAC preferences be different to True Reward preferences?

Yes, you can have different UAC and HSC True Reward preferences.

What happens if I get a HSC True Reward offer and then another offer on December 21?

If you get more than 1 offer, you can choose which one to accept.

What if I change my mind about what I want to study?

You can change your preferences on your HSC True Reward application until midnight, 11 December, 2017.

If I apply for HSC True Reward can I apply for courses at other universities?

Your application for HSC True Reward is a direct application to Western Sydney University. You can still apply through UAC for courses that are not available through HSC True Reward, including courses at other Universities.

Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv statement on Manus Island

Bishop Vincent Long OFM Conv, Bishop Delegate for Migrants and Refugees has issued a statement on behalf of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, following the closure of the Manus Island Centre. He states: "The policy of offshore detention has failed and it is time for us to deal with the issue of asylum seekers and refugees according to this nation's proud tradition and the best nature of its citizens. We can do a whole lot better, just as we did welcome "those who've come across the seas" after the wars in Europe and in Southeast Asia. The concern for maritime border security does not have to make us into a mean-spirited people. The policy of offshore detention has cost Australia dearly. But it has cost the detainees and their families even more. I appeal to the government and political leaders to act in accordance with our honourable tradition. It is time to find an alternative and conscionable solution, including accepting New Zealand's offer of resettlement and bringing the remaining detainees on Manus Island to Australia for further processing."
