Dear members of the St Columba's Community

NAPLAN testing has been conducted over the past two weeks at the College. I would like to commend all students in Years 7 and 9 for the way they conducted themselves throughout the testing period, and all members of staff whose efforts and support made it work so well. This was the first time that NAPLAN testing had been conducted online, and whilst some technical issues were evident on the first day, overall the testing ran smoothly. NAPLAN testing generates a lot of media attention, with regular stories about the impact of "high stakes" testing on student anxiety and their wellbeing. Our approach at the College is somewhat different to the sensationalism of the media. Our aim is to ensure that our students are aware of the true value of NAPLAN - that is, that it provides a "snapshot" of their current capabilities in a range of literacy and numeracy skills, and that the data provided guides teachers in designing and implementing learning strategies to support any identified possibilities for growth. All we ask is that students give it their best shot, and the evidence of the past two weeks would suggest that our students have embraced the opportunity without the stress and anxiety that NAPLAN may generate elsewhere.

On Tuesday we hosted a meeting of teachers and principals from four of our fellow CEDP Secondary Colleges, who were here to discuss their literacy, numeracy and formation Action Plans for the year. Our teachers were able to present how the NAPLAN data has guided the introduction of research projects in all faculties of the College, focussing on literacy and numeracy research that will assess the impact of teaching strategies on learning gain throughout the College. The use of evidence informed research for the benefit of student learning is at the forefront of current developments in education, so it is wonderful to see this being implemented throughout the College.



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The Safer Australian Roads and Highways (SARAH) Group was established after the tragic death of former student, Sarah Frazer, in 2012. Since that time Sarah's parents Peter and Judy have worked tirelessly to promote the need for greater safety on our roads. Their efforts in forming the SARAH group have had impact across Australia and Internationally. May we reflect on Sarah's death and the need for the road safety message of "Drive so others survive" to be delivered across the College and throughout the community. Our condolences as always extend to the Frazer family and Sarah's many friends. It is a very important message that needs to be delivered to all road users and governments.

May God continue to bless us, and guide us on life's great journey.

School Fees

School fee statements for the second instalment of school fees for 2019 have been mailed out. The due date for payment is on or before Wednesday 5th June 2019. If you have not yet received your statement, please contact me on 4754 8902 to arrange for a copy to be sent home.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

Withdrawal of a Student: A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

Split Accounts: Please note that the College does not recognise 50/50 split of accounts. Enrolment signatories are joint and severally responsible for payment of fees. This means that both enrolment signatories are equally responsible for the payment of 100% of the total amount owing on the school fees account and not a proportion of it. If you have any questions regarding this, please don't hesitate to contact me.

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ACAP - Changes to Admission Criteria

As part of these changes, ATARs will no longer be considered as part of ACAP's selection process. All applicants will now be required to undertake a screening interview, as well as meeting **one** of the following criteria:
