There are thousands of people dying all around the world for a bit of bread, but there are thousands more dying for a bit of love, or a bit of acknowledgement. The truth is that the worse disease today is not leprosy, tuberculosis or aids, it's being unwanted, it's being left out, it's being forgotten.


Star Spot- Chloe Corbett Year 8



Loretta graduated from the University of Western Sydney with a Bachelor of Arts majoring in Theatre and Creative Writing. After which she took up a role as the St Vincent de Paul Society's Youth and Young Adult Coordinator in the Diocese of Wollongong.

In 2006 Loretta moved to Melbourne to take up a position working for the Australian Province of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate. This role was an opportunity for her to continue her work as a founding member of the national Oblate Youth Australia community, working as Project Officer for the International Oblate Youth Encounter and as the Coordinator of Rosies Oblate Youth Mission, an outreach to the homeless community of Melbourne.

In 2009, Loretta took up the role of Youth Ministry Coordinator for the Catholic Diocese of Wollongong, working to develop a comprehensive approach to youth ministry across high schools and parishes, in collaboration with the Office of the Bishop and the Catholic Education Office.

Passionate about facilitating opportunities for spiritual formation and adult education, for the next three years Loretta worked for St Vincent's Health Australia as Mission Integration Manager working across St Vincent's and St Joseph's Hospitals.

At the beginning of 2018 she began in her current role of Mission Leader with Good Samaritan Education, working with staff and students across ten secondary colleges in mission formation.

SCHOOL FEES REMINDER

Thank you to the families who have finalised their second instalment of school fees for 2019. These fees were due on 5th June 2019.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account, it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

Withdrawal of a Student: A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

Split Accounts: Please note that the College does not recognise 50/50 split of accounts. Enrolment signatories are joint and severally responsible for payment of fees. This means that both enrolment signatories are equally responsible for the payment of 100% of the total amount owing on the school fees account and not a proportion of it. If you have any questions regarding this, please don't hesitate to contact me.




