Pastoral letter to the people and clergy of the Diocese of Parramatta

Dear friends,

The news concerning Cardinal George Pell and his conviction and incarceration on historic child sexual abuse crimes has dominated local and international media this week. Such news has caused a wide range of emotions in the community.

Even among Catholics, there is a sense of shame and anger at the betrayal that the clerical sex abuse crimes represent, and the hypocrisy they reveal. It is wider than simply the case of Cardinal Pell. We must respect the processes of the law and await the outcome of the appeal.

In the meantime, our primary concern must continue to be the care of the victims of sexual abuse.

The revisiting of such grievous wounds has been difficult for many. As we approach Lent, may we, too, grieve with all those suffering intensely. Genuine hope begins whenever we listen to the story of another with an open heart.

Some, too, feel that in the marketplace the "brand Catholic" has suffered a grievous blow. Perhaps so. But we are not a market nor are we a popular cult.

We are first and always a community of disciples following our one master, Jesus Christ. We are not the Church of one particular leader, be it Pope Francis or Cardinal Pell or any other bishop.

We are the living Body of Christ made up of saints and sinners.

We are challenged by Our Lord to reach out to all who are hurting, and to all victims of every abuse and sinfulness. We are to be the "field hospital" for all the marginalised as Pope Francis has asked us to become. We are to be in the messiness of life, not to run away into some "idealised future or romantic past."

To be such, demands that we let go of our sense of superiority, privilege and power and embrace again our need for healing and forgiveness and to look again at the Suffering Servant leader who is our Lord Jesus.

Many people may say these are only words and they would be correct. However, for us they are the words of Jesus and we are called to put our faith in Him and demonstrate it in our actions by our care for all in need.

The season of Lent summons us to a discipleship of humility, weakness and vulnerability, of dying and rising in Christ. We are challenged to remove our heart of stone and to have a heart of flesh instead.

During this period of crisis and darkness, as the Church, let us pray that we have the courage to die to that which is contrary to the Gospel, and rise to be what Christ has called us to be.

NSW School 7 Vaccination Program for Year 7, 2019

Dear Parents / Caregivers

Each year NSW Health works with schools to offer the vaccines recommended for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC).

Year 7 students

In 2019 NSW Health will offer:

Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in a 2-dose schedule at 0 and 6 months. Diptheria, Tetanus & Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine (dTpa) as a single dose

Clinic dates

Friday 29th March 2019 Year 7, dTp and 1st dose HPV – all students

Monday 17th June 2019 Year 7, dTp and 1st dose HPV -catch up

Monday 21st October 2019 Year 7, 2nd dose HPV Year 7 dTpa and 1st dose HPV - catch up

Parental/guardian consent is required for students to be vaccinated. Consent forms will only be accepted if they are completed using blue or black pen and are original (photocopies of faxed consent forms will not be consent forms will not be accepted).

If you would like your child to participate, please complete the attached consent form and sign the vaccination/s you require for your child. For vaccinations not required leave the box <u>blank</u>. Your child will be provided with a card showing the Record of Vaccination at each clinic. Parents/guardians should ensure this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not result this Parent of Vaccination do not receive this Record of Vaccination.

If your child misses a dose they will be offered that dose at the next clinic visit.

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM 2019

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians at the beginning of 2019.

- In 2019 the following vaccines will be offered FREE to Year 7 students:
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in a 2-dose schedule at 0 and 6 months. dTpa vaccine (diphtheria, tetanus & pertussis (whooping cough)) as a single dose.
- To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:
- read all the information provided
 complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
 return the completed consent form to their child's school as soon as nossible

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at: <u>www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.</u>

- Ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination
- A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic as a physical card.
- Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.
