I hope each and every member of our community had a wonderful Easter and were able to reflect upon the gift of life that we share.

College Assembly

This week as a community we were able to come together for a whole College assembly where I was able to reflect upon the current Federal election and the campaigning process that occurs in the lead up to the election next weekend. I spoke of the condemnation by both the Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition of the behaviour around the "egging" of the prime minister during the campaign. This bipartisan condemnation of this behaviour lead to discussion of the importance of having opinions, but also being able to respectfully debate differences of opinion without resorting to any form of violence or vilification of another person. Too many of the conflicts we see around the world, and the ongoing atrocities that have occurred since Christchurch, stem from a sense of superiority and entitlement that people falsely possess as a result of their opinion on race, religion, sexual preference, gender identification and so on. We see the same problem arise in peoples attempted justification for bullying, online and social media vilification of others. The egging incident presented to us all an opportunity to reflect upon the need to always treat other humans with dignity and respect. Our College prayer calls us to "Care for all people, act justly and love tenderly" To live in a country where this is held dear by both leaders of our major political parties is a source of reassurance to us all.

Online Grooming

An attempt at online grooming of one of our students was reported to me by the police this week. The perpetrator was located in Europe but used an elaborate and complex combination of identities to attempt to coerce the victim into providing inappropriate material. In setting up this grooming structure, online communication was able to occur despite the family using internet and Wi-Fi security software. Despite the security measures employed as part of the victim's social media account, the groomer was able to find out considerable details of the victim's interests and location through the victim's use of "hashtags" on social media posts. Please be vigilant in monitoring your children's use of social media and the internet. Whilst the benefits of the world wide web have transformed the way society interacts, and the immediacy of access to information, there exist equally concerning pitfalls that we must all continue to educate our children about and protect them against.

Attendance

Attendance at school has a vital and measurable impact upon our children's learning. The data supporting this is reflected in the CEDP attendance campaign title "Every Day Counts". Statistically, students taking more than 10 days off per year are at risk of a measurable, detrimental impact on their learning and success.

Please be aware of the number of days your child is missing from school, and work with us in the development of strategies to support you being able to get your child to school each day. Together we can ensure that they have every possible opportunity for success.

May God bless us all and continue to guide us on this wonderful journey together.

School Fees

School fee statements for the second instalment of school fees for 2019 have been mailed out. The due date for payment is on or before Wednesday 5th June 2019. If you have not yet received your statement, please contact me on 4754 8902 to arrange for a copy to be sent home.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

Withdrawal of a Student: A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

Split Accounts: Please note that the College does not recognise 50/50 split of accounts. Enrolment signatories are joint and severally responsible for payment of fees. This means that both enrolment signatories are equally responsible for the payment of 100% of the total amount owing on the school fees account and not a proportion of it. If you have any questions regarding this, please don't hesitate to contact me.
