The making of a Student leader at St Columba's Catholic College.

The process to elect student leaders at our College is built on the principle that leadership is not about popularity, but is earned through hard work and commitment. Our model of leadership enables every student in the College to be nominated for leadership.

In 2014 we launched our Student Awards scheme, which has been designed to acknowledge student achievement across all aspects of College life and is directly linked to our Student Leadership programme. In this scheme we recognise four levels of awards, Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum. At each level the students must accomplish the essential criteria before moving onto the next level. To achieve a Bronze award a student must receive five KLA Certificates and five Merit Certificates and they must achieve five Bronze awards before they are eligible to apply for their Silver award. When a student has achieved a Silver Award they are eligible to be nominated for College leadership if they are in Year 10 or Year 11.

When the nomination period takes place at the College all nominees are put forward for voting by the students in Year 10 and 11. The elected nominees are then taken away for leadership training by our Head of Mission Mrs Tracy Mulhall and one of our Leaders of Mission to participate in a leadership conference at the Christian Brothers Retreat Centre in Mulgoa. The students then take part in a number of learning activities, that explore their capacity for leading and the personal attributes and qualities that each will bring to their leadership experience.

The elected students from Year 11 will be asked during the conference to consider whether they believe they have the necessary leadership skills to become the College Captains and Vice Captains and on the final day of the conference the students who wish to be considered for these roles will be



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interviewed by the College leaders and will be ranked based on the following criteria: Executive and their peer

- Public Speaking
- Team player
- Ability to motivate
- Pride in self and school uniform and behaviour
- Ability to challenge peers positively
- Open to the opinions of others
- Demonstrates personal integrity

At this critical stage of our leadership process I would ask that you join with me in praying for our students to ensure that they continue to become the leaders our College needs for our future. I wish each one of them all the very best and thank them for being outstanding young women and men.



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



SCHOOL FEES REMINDER

Thank you to the families who have finalised their second instalment of school fees for 2019. These fees were due on 5th June 2019.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

Withdrawal of a Student: A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

Split Accounts: Please note that the College does not recognise 50/50 split of accounts. Enrolment signatories are joint and severally responsible for payment of fees. This means that both enrolment signatories are equally responsible for the payment of 100% of the total amount owing on the school fees account and not a proportion of it. If you have any questions regarding this, please don't hesitate to contact me.
