School Fees

School fee statements for the first instalment of school fees for 2019 (Billing Period 1-29/01/2019-17/05/2019) have been mailed out. The due date for payment is on or before Wednesday 20^{th} March 2019. However, due to issues delaying the posting of the 2019 fee statements, Catholic Education Office, Parramatta, have extended the due date for payment to Friday 29^{th} March 2019. If you have not yet received your statement, please contact me on 4754 8902 to arrange for a copy to be sent home.

The cutoff date for returning the required paperwork for the payment of the 2019 school fees by way of the Flexible Payment Plan to the Catholic Education Office, Parramatta, is 22^{nd} March 2019. The Catholic Education Office will not accept late requests. If you would like to pay the 2019 fees as per the amounts shown on the Flexible Payment Plan paperwork but have missed the cutoff date, please contact me as soon as possible so that I am able to set the arrangement up for you.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and understanding and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

N.B. If you were on a payment arrangement for 2018 (except Flexible Payment Plan or Salary Sacrifice) it is important that you contact me when you receive your Billing Period 1 statement so that I am aware of your intentions for the 2019 fees.

Payment Due Date: Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment of all Fees and Charges for the Current Term Fees will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

Withdrawal of a Student: A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

School fees can be paid by Bpoint, Bpay, Postbillpay, cash, Direct Debit, EFTPOS, credit card or cheque.

ADOLESCENT **SCOLIOSIS** SPINAL **CURVATURE**

How to detect Scoliosis.

Helpful information for schoolgirls in years 5 and 7 and their parents.

What is scoliosis?

Scoliosis is a lateral or sideways curve of the spine. The spine also rotates on its long axis as it curves. It usually develops during early adolescence (age 10-13 years) when growth is most rapid.

What is the cause of scoliosis?

The cause is unknown, but 80-90% of cases occur in otherwise healthy adolescents. This is called idiopathic (cause unknown) scoliosis.

We know that scoliosis is NOT contagious and NOT caused by bad posture, a soft mattress, carrying a heavy school bag or eating junk food.

Why is early detection important?

While very small curves are common and of no significance, about 2% of girls have a curve which warrants medical observation during the growth period. Three girls per 1,000 will require treatment during the growth phase.

If treatment is required, the earlier it is undertaken, the better the long-term result. This is the basis for screening since in the early stages scoliosis produces no symptoms. The way to detect scoliosis is to look for it!

The National Self-Detection Program for Scoliosis

This information is designed to make parents of schoolgirls aware of the outward signs of scoliosis.

Each year, all government and nongovernment girls' schools will be asked and by a direct approach to school principals, to download the Self-Detection Fact Sheet from www.scoliosis-australia.org and distribute it to girls in Years 5 and 7 (10 and 12 years of age in most states and territories).

This is the age range when scoliosis first appears. If after reading the Fact Sheet you or your parents think you may have this condition, please consult your family doctor.

Self-Detection Program for Scoliosis

What are the outward signs of Scoliosis?

Head not centred over body

One shoulder higher

One shoulder blade higher and possibly more prominent

Unusual gaps between arms and trunk

Spine obviously curved

One hip more prominent

How Scoliosis is detected.

Apart from the outward signs with a teenager standing as illustrated, the reliable Forward Bend Test is used in the diagnosis of scoliosis.

This simple visual examination requires the teenager to stand with the feet together and parallel and bending forward as far as she can go with the hands, palms facing each other, pointed between the two big toes.

In scoliosis, one side of the upper chest (thoracic) region or the lower back (lumbar) region will be more than 1cm higher than the other. The prominence is most often on the right side in the thoracic region.

If the difference between the two sides is less than 1cm, it is highly unlikely that a significant curvature is present and the difference is simply due to asymmetrical growth of the two sides of the body.

This is called torso asymmetry and is of no significance.

What about brothers and sisters?

Scoliosis tends to run in families. When a curve is detected in one member of the family, other children should also be examined by the family doctor. If there is a history of a blood relative, especially a female cousin, having been treated for scoliosis by brace wearing or surgery, then this strengthens the case for spinal examination as a regular health check between 10 and 13 years of age.

Scoliosis which requires treatment is far less common in boys than in girls. The ratio of boys to girls requiring treatment is about 1 to 10.

Is treatment successful?

Yes, modern methods produce excellent results when a curve is detected early. In most cases an inconspicuous spinal brace is worn. Surgery is needed in only one out of three cases which require treatment.

There is no scientific evidence that physical therapy (exercise programs) and spinal manipulation (chiropractic adjustments) will either correct a scoliosis or halt its progression.

What will happen if Scoliosis is not treated?

The curve may increase unnoticed during the growing years. Moderate and severe curves may also increase in adult life.

Some curves may increase with pregnancy. Severe pain, physical deformity and wear and tear arthritis may occur during middle life. Early detection is important for a healthy future.

How do you detect Scoliosis?

Simply look for it! It only takes 30 seconds.

Are you hearing me?


On Tuesday 12th March in Science, we tested how the age of the listener can impact the frequency they can hear. To do this we went around to different teachers and students. We measured 30cm from their head, then used an app called *F Generator* to test hearing by going up in frequency until they couldn't hear it anymore. We tested each person three times to calculate an average.

So far, we have discovered that on average, the older a person is, the lower the frequency they can hearmost of our teachers, who were past 65, could hear less than 11,500hz, whereas the teachers under 30 could hear over 15,000hZ. Some of the students could even hear beyond that!

ACCESS AND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

This year UAC's new Access and Scholarships Programs brochure has a summary of information on applying for access and scholarship programs through UAC. <u>Download the brochure</u>. Following is a summary of these schemes.

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES (EAS)

Institutions acknowledge that difficult circumstances can prevent students from reaching their true academic potential, particularly if their educational performance has been affected by long-term disadvantage beyond their control and choosing and so offer Educational Access Schemes (EAS).

There are some changes to Educational Access Schemes (EAS) for 2019. Find out more.

EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS

Equity Scholarships help financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with tertiary study. Details of requirements for individual scholarships can be found on participating institution's websites.

SCHOOLS RECOMMENDATION SCHEMES (SRS)

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission to Year 12 students. They do this by using criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR. You must apply through UAC for undergraduate admission in 2019–20 to be eligible for SRS. Find out how your school rates you.

SPECIAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Certain undergraduate courses such as medicine, dentistry, health science and law require applicants to sit an admissions test for entry.

Check the course descriptions via the <u>undergraduate course search</u> or the My UAC app to find out if the course you're interested in has any special entry requirements.

MEDICINE AND MEDICAL SCIENCES

Some institutions will require you to sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT). Find out more. A summary of these requirements can be found in the Medicine and Medical Sciences fact sheet.

The Law Admission Test (LAT) is a selection test developed to assess the types of aptitudes and skills that are critical to success in undergraduate level law program at UNSW Sydney.


