A few points...

As Term Two comes to an end, I would like to emphasise a few points that I made to the Parents and students at our Information evenings held this semester.. These points are applicable to all students in every year group.

- As of 2010 the legal age for students leaving school was mandated as seventeen. Employers expect students coming into the workforce to have their Higher School Certificate.
- Educational research indicates that a student's exit results in Year 12 are not determined in Year 12 but in Year 9 by their level of literacy and Numeracy. (Australian Council for Educational Research) This reality is a stark reminder to all of us that a young person's future is being determined at a very early age.
- As parents and as teachers we have a responsibility to ensure that our students are held accountable for their engagement in the learning process. No longer can we allow our students to postpone their commitment to learning or allow them to believe that they will take their learning more seriously when they move into senior study. Perhaps the saying "that today is the first day of the rest of my life" should become the mantra for many of our young people. Because ultimately, this decision to focus on learning is really in their hands and we the parents and teachers can only guide them to make the right decisions.

School Fees Reminder

Thank you to the families who have finalised their second instalment of school fees for 2019. These fees were due on 5th June 2019.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the Business Manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete an Application for School Fees Assistance so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please



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be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

Withdrawal of a Student: A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

Split Accounts: Please note that the College does not recognise 50/50 split of accounts. Enrolment signatories are joint and severally responsible for payment of fees. This means that both enrolment signatories are equally responsible for the payment of 100% of the total amount owing on the school fees account and not a proportion of it. If you have any questions regarding this, please don't hesitate to contact me.

UNSW - Law Admission Test (LAT)

The LAT 2019 will take place on **Thursday 3 October 2019**.

Standard registrations for the LAT 2019 are open and will close at 5:00pm AEST on Friday 16 August 2019.

Late registrations will also be accepted from 5:00pm AEST on Friday 16 August 2019 until 5:00pm AEST Wednesday 11 September 2019. A late registration fee applies to all application completed during the late registration period. Test registrations will only be accepted during the published registration period; registrations will not be accepted after the late registration closing date under any circumstances.

The LAT is a written test that allows candidates to demonstrate their aptitude and skills for studying Law at UNSW Sydney. LAT results will be considered in addition to the ATAR (or equivalent academic result) in the UNSW Sydney selection process to differentiate amongst the many high achieving Law applicants. Completion of the LAT will enable UNSW Sydney to gain a more rounded view of a candidate's capability to study Law; it will also give applicants the opportunity to demonstrate further their suitability for the Law program at UNSW Sydney.

He said the scholarships, which will pay for tutoring, uniforms, stationery, books, laptops plus excursions and camps, offer children who may face financial barriers to reaching their potential a "boost" that better enables them to reach their own successful outcomes.

"We want students to apply who want to help shape the future of Greater Western Sydney but who may be facing family challenges now that threaten their capacity to access TAFE or university entry," he said.
